Dangerous TikTok challenges are back in the news again. A teenager in France has died while trying the viral "scarf game" on TikTok – a variation of the deadly "blackout challenge" - that has claimed several lives over the last year.

And a mother has issued a warning about the viral "tap out" challenge - also known as the blackout game – after she discovered youngsters playing it in a playground in the UK.

There's also a concerning new report out that's found children spend the majority of their free time on their computers or devices. Over half of youngsters aged five to 13 are spending 23 hours a week - almost a whole day - online.

Parents may be interested to know that TikTok has introduced a new feature that allows them to control the content their children can view on the app. Part of the platform's family pairing functionality, the feature enables adults to connect their account to their teenager's and manage settings such as screen time limits.

Last year, the app added a tool that automatically filters out videos with words or hashtags users may not want to see on their screen. Now the new update means that parents and guardians can set these content filters for their children.

"We're bringing this tool to Family Pairing to empower caregivers to help reduce the likelihood of their teen viewing content they may uniquely find jarring," TikTok wrote

In other news, if you come across a Facebook post that appeals for information about a missing fiveyear-old girl called Sofia, disregard it. It has been declared a hoax. This can be used to teach children how to use critical thinking skills. Often the content of these posts are edited and completely changed once they're going viral!
