You may have picked up from the press that these were considered to be some of the hardest SATs tests ever given to Year 6 children. They really have been a true test of resilience and courage. Many children across the country broke down, or gave up. Our children did incredibly well in dealing with them however, showing perseverance and focus throughout the week. No matter what the outcomes, they have all done well in my eyes and I was very proud of their positive attitudes. Year 2, Year 1 and Year 4 all have National assessments in the coming weeks and we wish them all the best with these.

Well done to all the children who made hats they were fabulous! I couldn't decide one winner, so there were lots of winners! ③




